





Blueberry pollen is sticky and relatively heavy, therefore, in order to set fruit, the flowers of a blueberry plant must be pollinated by insects.

Did you know?



Native Americans called blueberries "star berries" because the blossom end of each berry -- the calyx-- forms a perfect five-pointed star.

Blueberry bushes can grow up to 12 feet tall.
